



Seminar – Green Initiative – Collaboration for Environmental Rights and Duties under the Constitution



A seminar on "Green Initiative – Cooperation for Environmental Rights and Duties under the Constitution" was held at Navsarjan. Citizens gathered to discuss environmental protection and enhancement, recognizing it as a civic duty. Among those present were Mrs. Jignasaben Ozha (Regional Officer, GPCB), Mr. Snehal Patel (Nature Club Surat), Fr. Dr. Suresh Anthony SJ (PEJ Coordinator, St. Xavier's College, Ahmedabad), Fr. Melvin Dsa SJ, and Mr. Samir Macwan (Director, Navsarjan). The seminar provided a platform for government and social organizations to share their work and experiences. Various Surat-based organizations and citizens discussed their efforts in fulfilling the duty outlined in Article 51(a) of the Constitution. Attendees were urged to take initiative and participate in local environmental conservation efforts to help preserve Surat's environment.





Seminar – Green Initiative – Collaboration for Environmental Trainings in Surat Municipal Corporation run schools Rights and Duties under the Constitution



Navsarjan, in coordination with Surat Municipal Corporation schools, provided training to 691 students across four schools. Sunil Vatas of Navsarjan trained 359 students (standards 6-8) at schools Number 258 and number 17 on the negative impacts of internet and social media. Using videos, the training highlighted the disadvantages of social media and its effects on mental health, encouraging students to limit mobile phone use and focus on career development. Additionally, Sangitaben Thakur of Navsarjan conducted training on gender, emotional, and mental health for 332 students (standards 6-8) at schools number 213 and number 263. This training aimed to raise awareness about the importance of gender equality and mental well-being.

Republic Day Celebration - Love for the Nation



Navsarjan celebrated Republic Day in 22 regions, promoting national unity and patriotism. Approximately 4,150 - 4,200 people participated in the festivities, which included local rallies, children-led prayers, recitations of the Indian Preamble, flag-raising ceremonies Honoring chief guests, and children's performances featuring patriotic songs, dances, and short plays highlighting national leaders. Parents and community members expressed their joy, particularly appreciating the Preamble recitations. A strong sense of national pride was evident among all attendees.



Seminar, Green Initiative, Collaboration for Environmental Empowering Adolescents: Health and Wellness Camp for Teenage Girls Rights and Duties, Health and Environmental



Navsarjan held specialized adolescent camps for 83 teenage girls from Laxminarayannagar, Nagsennagar, and Rasulabad. The camps focused on empowering girls through education on key topics including menstruation, physical and mental health, education, and marriage. Participants learned about the importance of nutrition, hygiene, and exercise for well-being. Discussions covered menstruation (its nature, process, and importance), maintaining physical and mental health, the value of education and career planning, responsible decision-making, and practical tips for a fulfilling life. Information was supplemented with posters to enhance understanding. The girls were enthusiastic about the new knowledge, which many had not previously received. Mothers expressed gratitude, noting the valuable insights gained by their daughters and encouraging future camps.

Empowering Communities: Kidney Disease Awareness Camp

Navsarjan conducted a kidney disease awareness camp in Zeromodi, Hadpatiwas, and Bhathena, educating 97 women about kidney health, symptoms, and treatment options. The initiative aimed to increase awareness and empower individuals to recognize potential kidney problems. Participants received free blood sugar and blood pressure check-ups to encourage proactive health monitoring. This comprehensive approach promoted both understanding of kidney disease and personal health management. During the camp, two participants were identified with high blood pressure and one with high blood sugar, and all three were advised to seek medical attention. The camp identified a woman with severe kidney issues who receives weekly dialysis at Muscat Hospital and faces significant medication costs. The Renal Foundation has contacted her and pledged to assist with these expenses. Navsarjan remains committed to promoting health awareness and community well-being through initiatives focused on early detection and prevention of kidney disease.





Seminar – Green Initiative – Meeting of Navchetna members – Seminar on the rights of migrant workers Rights and Duties under the Constitution



Twenty-seven Navchetna members met to discuss several topics. These included membership fees for the local women's association, depositing council fees and Women's Day contributions, Women's Day celebrations, and a letter to the Municipal Commissioner regarding housing documents. Following the meeting, five Navchetna representatives submitted the appeal letter concerning the housing documents to the Municipal Commissioner and presented their case.

A seminar on migrant worker rights, organized by Mahila Shram Shakti Kendra, saw participation from four NGOs, including two representatives from Navsarjan, Dhanvantari Rath employees, a Building and Other Construction Workers (BOCW) officer, and a Citilink officer. The seminar highlighted the challenges in ensuring migrant workers' rights and facilitated a detailed discussion of these difficulties.



Kite day Celebration: Children's enthusiasm overflowed

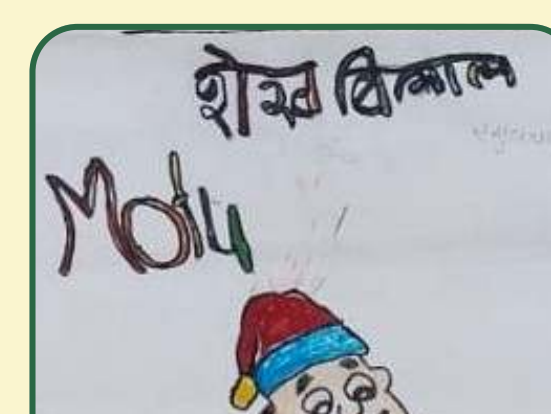
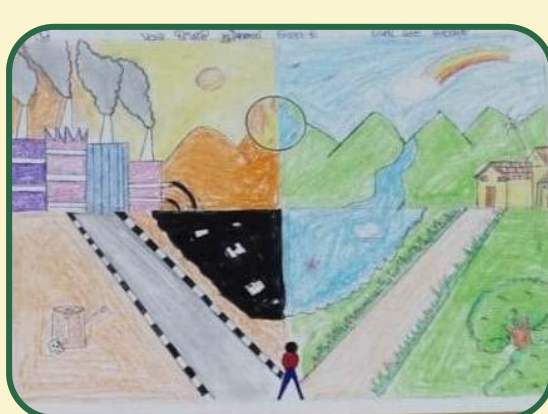

Seminar – Green Initiative – Collaboration for Environmental Bhagyalakshmi Credit Co-operative Society Rights and Duties under the Constitution

The Bhagyalakshmi Credit Co-operative Society Limited continued its support for members this month, disbursing ₹475,000 in loans to 10 members for various needs, including school fees, house taxes, installment payments, and medical expenses. These loans have significantly contributed to the members' financial stability and well-being. The society also welcomed 124 new members, expanding its reach and potential for future growth. This expansion strengthens the society's financial base and its capacity to empower more individuals. A core committee meeting with 15 members was held to discuss income and expenditure, monthly accounts, and strategies for increasing membership.
